Our Mission: At Camp Hyanto, we believe that our ministry is to teach the children who attend our camp about Jesus Christ and his love for them, to raise up young leaders in the Diocese and to help our largely young, adult staff to grow in their faith and embrace their God given gifts for evangelism and leadership, and to give the parishes in our diocese ministry opportunities and a sense of ministering to children and youth.

Purchased in the Spring of 1946 and dedicated on July 23, 1947, Camp Hyanto began with a desire for the establishment of a Christian summer camp within the Anglican Diocese of Ontario. The initial goal of Camp Hyanto was to give “impetus to the moral and spiritual development” of children and teens. In 1951 this goal was expanded to giving people “a holiday in Camp Life” and “that children would receive instruction in church teaching, handicrafts, games, and those things that build character with good citizenship.”

Heading into our 68th year after the dedication of Camp Hyanto, we remain committed to the development of the whole child: physical, emotional, social, mental, and spiritual. We encourage this development through community living, family-style meals, daily Chapel and prayer, a wide variety of games, activities, arts & crafts, and opportunities for educational and leadership development of all ages. Just speak with one of our campers, long-time staff, or dedicated volunteers to begin to understand why “**We, who sleep beneath the pines, sleep well**” Or, better yet, come join us and experience the Hyanto difference yourself!
